Our State Major Project

Last week, Dixie, a 21 month old child could hear for the very first time!

She was born early with Congenital CMV and was completely deaf. She also has feeding issues and damage to her vocal cords. She is smart as can be but has neuromuscular difficulties related to the CMV. In therapy we have been working on developing her strength and balance for sitting and mobility. Progress was slow at first, however in the last couple months she has made exciting progress. She is now sitting on her own and has begun to crawl. We think her curiosity and drive to explore finally overrode her stubborn desire to be held in someone's lap!



Her family and I are very proud of her!



Last month she had cochlear implant surgery.

A cochlear implant is an electronic medical device that replaces the function of the damaged inner ear. Unlike hearing aids, which make sounds louder, cochlear implants do the work of damaged parts of the inner ear (cochlea) to provide sound signals to the brain. Her device was 'turned on' last week. She will now begin a special training program to help her make sense of what she is hearing and learn to communicate.

Dixie's Elks Therapy Program continues to work on her strength and balance for mobility and also feeding issues. Due to so many medical

appointments far away, her family truly appreciates the Elk's home based therapy approach. Mom is able to integrate therapy exercises and activities into their daily routines.
